Agave titanota

This very unusual agave comes from Oaxaca, Mexico and was originally described by Felipe Otero. The leaf edges develop a very interesting bony margin and leaf printing. The thorns on the leaf margins are dull and gentle although they look very fierce. Large plants take many years to develop with rosettes reaching about 24 inches in diameter. Excellent for both garden and container culture.

GROWTH HABIT	Solitary, produces a few offsets at base.
DROUGHT TOLERANCE	Extreme
USDA HARDINESS	Zone 9 (20°-30°F) Can tolerate a few degrees below freezing.
SPECIAL NOTES	Very exotic appearance.
